## Ending Child Marriage

ZIF was the first private-sector donor to the UNFPA-UNICEF Global Programme to Accelerate Action to End Child Marriage, providing support for adolescent girls as it engages communities in changing norms

that perpetuate the practice.
Almost 650 million women in the world today were wed before their 18th birthday. By 2030, if trends continue, that number could reach one billion. Child marriage is a global violation of human rights, and ZIF has committed $\$ 2$ million for efforts in 12 countries. Globally, Zonta clubs support this effort, campaigning with the slogan " 18 , no exceptions."

## Let Us Learn Madagascar

Most Madagascans live on $\$ 2$ a day or less. Many children cannot access formal education, and one-third of girls will become pregnant by age 18. ZIF will continue support for UNICEF's Let Us Learn for two more years, adding $\$ 1$ million to enable vulnerable and at-risk girls to access education in a secure environment.

## Eid bi Eid (Hand in Hand)

Eid bi Eid is a multi-year initiative addressing issues from the refugee crisis, especially in Jordan, which hosts 1.4 million Syrian refugees - nearly one-tenth of the population. ZIF has committed $\$ 1$ million to UN Women to help Syrian and Jordanian women access sustainable employment, protective services, and community engagement, maximizing equality and reducing gender violence.

## Scholarships and Awards



ZIF also provides annual scholarships and awards, many starting at club level, to women in the traditionally male
 fields of aerospace, engineering, business, and public affairs. In 2019, Zonta International initiated a new Women in Technology Scholarship as well. The first scholarship awards for this pilot program were presented to district/region and international recipients representing 22 countries.

This snug, 40-year-old home could be named "Living Sustainably." Minnesotans Charles Sobczak and Molly Heuer, island residents since 1984, have created a home space unlike any other - welcoming, intriguing, and uniquely personal. Charles, long-time Realtor and published author of ten books, including the bestselling "Living Sanibel,"
 and wife Molly settled here in 1986 and raised two sons, exemplifying their guiding philosophy: "Recycle, Re-use, Reclaim."


Molly, who has a background in interior design, is the driving force behind architectural salvage and curbside rescue and an ardent advocate for sustainable living: "I try not to buy anything new." Charles is the wizard behind repurposing activities and
a recognized stained-glass artist.

Tucked into a quiet neighborhood at the heart of the island, their home is packed with mementos of their adventurous travels and shared values. From a

stuffed pronghorn antelope on a wall - a garage sale find - to the kitchen's double sink rescued from a Baltimore junkyard, every item has a story. We'll enter by walking on stair treads rescued from a dumpster; rear steps came from a ship. Many treasures have
been snatched from the wrecker's ball or otherwise rescued from oblivion.

The couple's beliefs are widely on display, along with talent in adapting their "finds" to enhance their home. Rear deck seating was trucked from a bowling alley in Asheville, NC, and most of the interior doors were salvaged from a central Florida hotel. Thrift and consignment store finds abound: The aqua refrigerator is from a Habitat ReStore. Kitchen floor tile, like the stair treads, was rescued from commercial construction.
 Exploring this very personal and unique Sanibel home is a rare privilege - prepare to be inspired!

as some interior walls. Living area ceilings were raised and a COREtec ${ }^{\circ}$ (cork-backed vinyl) floor installed, easy on the feet. The original Florida room floor was raised to allow smooth transition from kitchen to a new dining area.
 Now one can walk out

to the new screened pool from the living/ dining areas and the master bedroom.

Additional space was gained by pushing out the original screened-in front entry and installing elegant double doors. A gas fireplace provides a focal point, positioned to allow uninterrupted views from living room seating to both the fire element and the lake.

The kitchen was gutted and masterfully
refashioned; entertaining is a breeze with a sparkling kitchen and adaptable work surfaces.

The original Jack and Jill bathroom was reconfigured to become a spacious master bath.

Roof solar panels provide sufficient energy to warm and cool the home, heat the pool, and power the couple's hybrid electric car. "We hardly ever use air-conditioning

when we're here in the winter months," Kassie said. "We just open all the sliders and the front door and enjoy cool breezes."

Look for the outdoor "spirit house," a custom borrowed from Bali and Thailand, an element included in the couple's various homes for 25
 years; this one contains a Buddha statue. Spirit houses ensure that the indigenous spirits of land, water, and sky have a home when "foreigners" disrupt natural habitat
 to make room for their abodes.
Fun fact on the home: The ornamental garden inside the pool cage was created to add a few square feet of impermeable surface to conform with City of Sanibel rules, and which the homeowners now love.

This stunning, Spanishstyle home is a brandnew stand-out in a quiet neighborhood that dates to the 1970s when homes were uniformly of the ground-level, Michigan style.
"Kastély" means "mansion" in Hungarian, and "Strawberry" is the
nickname of the homeowners' young granddaughter Violet, a natural strawberry blonde, who spends much of her time with them.

A vacant lot on a long lake caught the attention of Laszlo Csiki, an investment engineer - Hungarian is his native language - and his Britishborn wife Judy Csiki-Sarsby, a former business owner and champion rower. They wanted a more tranquil lifestyle than was provided by their Orlando vacation home. They purchased

the lot in 2018 and selected Beattie Development based on the design portfolio the firm offered. The structure was completed by the holiday season of 2019.

Inside, the decor is sleekly modern, with every convenience, but also stylishly comfortable. On each side of

the front door are custom-made stained-glass panels depicting birds and flowers; a motif that pops up elsewhere.

Much of the furniture is from Roche Bobois, the Miami company that specializes in European styles, principally French imports. A family room off the entry hall is stuffed with Moorish-style sofas by Kenzo Takada that unfold to create a TV-watching pit, with an oversize wall-mounted TV.


Family life is easy with an open floor plan,
 moving seamlessly from kitchen to dining to comfortable seating around a fireplace and another TV. A Roche Bobois dining table and chairs stand ready for family mealtimes, and oversize rugs, designed by Judy, add splashes of color. Sliders open to a large screened porch with comfortable seating and a massive outdoor grill, overlooking a free-form pool with spa and bubbling fountains.

A special joy for the homeowners is the expansive view of a rookery, crowded with bird life in late afternoon - the tranquility they had sought when choosing Sanibel.

Upstairs, the south-facing master bedroom offers a Sanibel vibe, with its restful, sea-blue wall covering, opening to a sun-filled deck. Nearby, Violet's room is painted a soft lilac color and is filled with delights for a visiting
 nine-year-old.

In 2008, Dick Fortune and Sara Lopez, Miami photographers who had visited Sanibel for years, bought an odd-shaped lot on a quiet street. Busy with professional lives, they envisioned a home there - possibly for retirement? - and as they dreamed, years passed.

Eventually, working with S.A.M. Builders of Fort Myers, those dreams sprang to life, blossoming into a spacious home featuring an open floor plan, eco-sensibilities, and closeness to nature. In late 2018, the couple settled into the strikingly modern structure, so private that no window treatments are needed. The finished design sits snugly on the lot, as they dreamed, with serene views of canal and preserve.


After serving in the U.S. Coast Guard, Dick created a business in flooring, with Sara as his right hand. Both backgrounds are reflected in the décor. Nautical artifacts decorate the pool area, which is also the main entry. An enthusiastic artisan, Dick's metalwork creations

grace walls and shelves throughout. A boat hangs over wide, floating stairs of Brazilian walnut; the grand piano was rescued during an insurance dispute.

The open living space encourages hospitality. Sara, a former BellSouth project manager turned
 photographer and cook, designed the kitchen, dreaming of touches such as a gas-fired stove top and hands-free faucet. The guest bedroom is furnished almost completely
 with consignment store finds from "trips up and down US-41." The light-filled master bedroom opens to a private deck overlooking the preserve.

Images by Dick and Sara, staff photographers for "Island Scene," are featured in Charles Sobczak's wildlife books, and the collaboration was noted in the dedication for "Living Sanibel." On their website is a comment: "The couple has brought new meaning to wildlife that is up close and personal." Their home is too: Spacious yet comfortable, and warmly welcoming.

The vision of an extraordinary group of women began in Buffalo, NY, in 1919, one year before the Voting Rights Act of 1920 gave women in the United States the right to vote.

Since then, Zonta has become an international organization in 63 countries with over 29,000 members.

Zonta members work locally and internationally to make gender equality a reality for women and girls all over the world. Locally our Club partners with organizations from Habitat for Humanity's Women Build to PACE programs for at-risk girls, providing grants and hands-on involvement to further the Zonta mission of empowering women.


## In Memoriam

Orlene Shimberg, 1939-2019


Wife, mother and grandmother, FitBit enthusiast, friend - Orlene was many things, but first and foremost a Zontian. A former teacher and snowbird from Columbus, Ohio, she served on the Literacy Team and was Club President in 2012-2013. Her contribution each year to the success of "A Peek at the Unique" was seeking and choosing houses.

Orlene left us on July 4 after an amazing four-year battle with glioblastoma, the brain cancer that claimed Senator John McCain - "amazing" because median life expectancy, post-diagnosis, is 14 months.

In 2018, the Chamber of Commerce of Sanibel-Captiva named her Citizen of the Year. As her illness progressed, she mourned the loss of activities into which she had poured her heart, her considerable energy, and her intellect. Her legacy will forever be her quest for those unique "Peek" homes, but we remember too her wit, vision, and determination.

She is missed by husband Steve; son Ken and daughter Jessica and their families; and her Zonta friends, who honored her memory with donations to Zonta.
